Display Your Tiger Pride on Your Ride-SC Residents Only

If you reside in South Carolina and own one or more vehicles, purchasing a Benedict College License tag for your vehicle(s) will promote school pride and support BCNAA Scholarship program. Our goal for the scholarship fund is \$500,000 within the next five years.

Benedict College License Plates are \$70.00 plus the registration fee. Forty dol-

lars of the special plate fee will be sent to the specified school for scholarships. You may use Form MV-95 to apply for these plates. This plate can be purchased for cars or light trucks with an empty weight of 9,000 pounds or less and a gross vehicle weight of 11,000 pounds or less. Also, you may take your current tag into any DMV office and make the

Make A Right on Grady H. Donald Blvd

The Reverend Grady Donald left a tremendous impact in Anderson, SC, Tennessee and New York. Because of his dedication and commitment to service those in need the Bronx New York now carries on his legacy. Make a right turn on what is officially "Grady H. Donald Blvd."

On June 15th the official unveiling took place on the same street that houses the grateful residence and church site where Rev. Donald was the pastor for 27 years.

Reverend Donald was born in Belton, SC in 1929. At the tender age of 14 he decided to go into ministry quotes his niece, Annie Earl. After graduating from Reed Street High School in Anderson Rev. Donald attended

Benedict College in Columbia, SC. In 1950 he became an ordained minister. As one of the original Freedom Riders, Rev. Donald became very active in the Civil Rights Movement. He also organized the Nashville Christian Leadership Council, a group of ministers who led the city's civil rights movement in the 1960s. So if you're ever in the Bronx New York make a stop on Grady H. Donald Blvd.
