HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT DR. DIETRA TRENT

The Doctor of Laws (LL.D.) Degree

Throughout your career, the mission of Dietra Trent has been to bring communities together in pursuit of a more equitable and inclusive society. When asked what made you choose to engage in this work, you responded, "As a public-school teacher for 40 years, my grandmother not only made an incredible impact on her community, but she also motivated me to continue her efforts. She was my teacher, but she was also my mentor, and so she believed that every child, if given the right opportunity, could succeed. She worked with high poverty kids in our communities – a lot of minority students."

You earned a bachelor's degree in sociology and criminal justice from Hampton University and completed your master's and doctoral degrees in public administration and policy from Virginia Commonwealth University. You have over twenty-five years of experience working to advance equity for Virginia's most disadvantaged. Like your grandmother, you are interested in how public policies impact students and others living in marginalized communities. In pursuit of your life-long passion, you served in several leadership positions at George Mason University, including chief of staff and interim Vice President for Compliance, Diversity, and Ethics. Later you were appointed as Virginia's Secretary of Education. Prior to that appointment, you served as Deputy Secretary of Education. Having served in the Administrations of three former Governors of Virginia, you have a wealth of federal, state, and higher education experience and you have witnessed the tremendous impact that public policies play in increasing, or reducing, opportunities for groups and individuals.

You spoke of your blessings "to hold significant positions in three governor's offices" and to see how policy has worked to either include or exclude individuals as roles that has fueled your passion around issues of equity."

In February 2023, President Joseph Biden appointed you as Executive Director of the White House Initiative on Advancing Educational Equity, Excellence and Economic Opportunity through Historically Black Colleges and Universities. You are the first Black woman to be appointed to this position and you currently bear the awesome responsibility for advocating in the halls of government for 101 Historically Black Colleges and Universities and 280,000 students. As a proud graduate of Hampton University, an HBCU, you have "spent many years working to advance the mission and elevate the status of these great institutions." Noting that HBCUs were founded when other institutions refused to accept Black students, you stated they have "fostered academic excellence and created pathways to opportunity and you look forward to spending the next few years advancing and promoting HBCUs."

GlobalMindED network wrote that it is "thrilled to see the intentional election of a Black woman in this role. This selection symbolizes a recognition of the power, leadership, and importance in having diverse voices at the table, especially when representing our future leaders and change makers of the United States."

And, for these reasons, Benedict College is pleased to welcome you to its distinguished family of honorary degree recipients.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT DR. MARSHALL C. GRIGSBY

The Doctor of Laws (LL.D.) Degree

Marshall C. Grigsby has impacted higher education for more than fifty years after graduating from Morehouse College. After serving with distinction at the University of Chicago Divinity School, Howard University, and Hampton University, you have returned home to Benedict College where you had your greatest accomplishments as President from 1985-1993. Your remarkable educational career prepared you for servant leadership based upon your immersion in scripture at the Divinity Schools and immersion in solving real life challenges and possibilities at some of the nation's most celebrated Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU)s.

At Howard University Divinity School, your success at fundraising more than doubled the school's enrollment and budget. As executive vice-president, provost, and chief operating officer of Hampton University, you successfully navigated the day-to-day operations of the University's academic and student affairs divisions as well as its athletic programs. You also served with distinction on Capitol Hill on the staff of the Committee on Education and Workforce of the United States House of Representatives for Higher Education and conceptualized and developed policy, strategic and legislative initiatives that advanced the causes of access, retention, accountability, and availability of educational opportunities for all.

After serving eight years on Capitol Hill, you established and serve as President and CEO of Grigsby and Associates, an educational, legislative and policy development consulting firm that specializes in educational policy issues, strategic planning and consults on minority recruitment initiatives and management concerns. Current and recent clients include: The U. S. Department of Education, the White House Initiative on HBCUs, the National Association for Equal Opportunity in Education (NAFEO), and the United Negro College Fund (UNCF).

It was your role as the twelfth President of Benedict College that you provided your most memorable contributions to academia. During your eight-year tenure, programs were initiated that helped the institution achieve national recognition to include the implementation of the first undergraduate environmental health science program in the Southeast and establishment of the first college-wide honors program. You also initiated Project AFTER (Armed Forces Teacher Education for Retirees), a teacher education recruitment targeting African American male retired military personnel. You also established the Charter Day Awards Program which recognized the accomplishments of South Carolina corporations in advancing the cause of diversity and inclusion within their ranks and became the premiere college fundraising event.

In 1991, Benedict was one of five liberal arts colleges selected nationwide as a recipient of the Knight Foundation Presidential Leadership Award designed to recognize creative and innovative presidential leadership at small liberal arts colleges throughout America. Benedict College was also identified in both the 1992 and 1993 editions of Money Magazine's College Guide as offering one of the best values in American Higher Education for the dollar. In addition, during your tenure, unrestricted giving to the College increased by 85% and restricted giving by 86%, and the College's land holdings increased from 20 to 160 acres.

And, last but certainly not least, your two daughters, two grandchildren and wonderful wife have helped you understand at an even deeper level the importance and meaning of patience, understanding, forgiveness and love.

Benedict College is pleased to invite home one of its illustrious former Presidents and is proud to welcome you to its distinguished family of honorary degree recipients.

THE ACADEMIC REGALIA

The caps, gowns, and hoods worn at college and university functions date back to the Middle Ages. Monks and students used them to keep warm in medieval castles and halls of learning. From these practical origins, they have developed into the accepted garb which symbolizes scholarly achievement.

The master's degree gown is worn open, and the sleeve is cut so that the forearm comes through a slit just above the elbow. Gowns for the doctor's degree are also worn open. They carry broad, velvet panels down the front, and three velvet bars on the full round sleeves. This velvet trimming may be either black or the color distinctive of the degree.

Mortarboards or caps worn with baccalaureate and master's gowns have black tassels. The tassel of the doctoral cap is usually made of gold bullion.

The hood gives color and real meaning to the academic costume. Its silk lining bears the color of the institution conferring the degree. The hood is bordered with velvet of a prescribed width and color to indicate the field of learning to which the degree pertains as follows: medicine, green; music, pink; nursing, apricot; pharmacy, olive green; public administration, peacock blue; science, golden yellow; social work, citron; theology, scarlet; architecture, blue-violet; arts, letters, and humanities, white; business, drab; dentistry, lilac; education, light blue; engineering, orange; fine arts, brown; law, purple; and philosophy, dark blue.

Faculty members and guests in today's procession are wearing gowns and hoods which represent their disciplines, their degrees, and the institutions from which they received degrees.

THE MEDALLION OF HONORS

To demonstrate their high academic achievement through the School of Honors, these graduates receive the Medallion of Honors. The gold medallion contains a torch inside a V for Victory and is hung on a purple and white ribbon. The medallion is worn by Honors Seniors at formal convocation activities, graduation, and serves as a reminder of their commitment to world service.

THE COLLEGE MACE

The ceremonial academic mace is an historical amalgam of the regal scepter of rulers with the weapon-like instrument known as a mace. Academic maces are historically regarded as manifestations of the 'immortal dignity' of colleges and universities and thus represent the past, present and future. The College Mace is carried in procession on occasions of outstanding importance, such as commencements, convocations, and formal dedications. The placement of the Mace on its stand signals that the proceedings are about to come to order; its retirement indicates the conclusion of the exercises.

The College Mace was commissioned as a gift to the College by the Class of 2002. It was designed and fashioned by sculptor and Assistant Professor of Art, Michael Hale of Benedict College. It is fifty-two inches in length, constructed of bronze, velvet, and oak. Surmounting the Mace is the Great Seal of the College cast in solid bronze. A sphere made of four bronze stanchions represents the Office of the President, Administration, Academic Affairs, and Student Affairs. The sphere sits upon a bronze greave representative of the College's Board of Trustees. The staff of the Mace is constructed of solid oak with sixteen cabochon amethysts set in 24-carat gold bezels. The oak staff represents the strength of our academic programs, and the amethysts are representative of the College's faculty, staff, students, eleven academic departments and five schools that existed in 2002. The solid bronze greave at the base of the staff is representative of our founder, Mrs. Bathsheba Benedict. The Mace is completed with a final bronze sphere. The four stanchions of the

final sphere represent the original vocations offered by the College: Teaching, Preaching, Painting, and Carpentry.

Ms. Kennedy Carey, President of the Senior Class is carrying the College Mace at today's convocation.

THE PRESIDENT'S MEDALLION

The 3 1/2" cast bronze President's Medallion encompasses the Benedict College Seal inscribed with the words, "Office of the President," on the outer border.

The Medallion is suspended from the neck chain containing fourteen small bronze panels and two decorative laurel wreaths on the connecting links. Thirteen bronze panels are engraved with the names of the former Benedict College presidents. The fourteenth bronze panel is engraved with the name of the current president.

The President's Medallion was carried aboard the space shuttle Columbia in its 2.5-million-mile voyage around the Earth in 1986.

SCHOOL OF SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING

MR. LAJAY LAWRENCE

A leader inside and outside the classroom, Mr. Lajay Lawrence truly exemplifies what it means to represent TheBESTofBC.

Mr. Lawrence is an outstanding student with a 3.95 GPA, a winner of the President's Trophy, and a member of the Benedict College Honors Program. Additionally, he is a member of the National Society of Black Engineers (NSBE) and the International Student Association (ISA). According to his professors, Mr. Lawrence has an exceptional understanding of technology concepts and displays strong leadership skills including but not limited to problem-solving, time management, and teamwork. As a peer, Mr. Lawrence has committed over 120 hours each year to tutoring fellow students since he enrolled at Benedict College. In addition to tutoring, he is also a founding member and the first lead of the Google Developer Student Club, which has created a relationship between Benedict College and Google to bring necessary industry resources to campus to expand the students' skills and learning processes.

Not only has Mr. Lawrence excelled in academics, but he is also an active community member in causes that he is passionate about. He has been the director of information technology at the Jamaica Coalition Against Domestic Violence since his freshman year and is currently the youngest person serving on the board of directors. He also worked as a graphic designer for International Friendship Ministries based in Columbia, South Carolina.

He is the founder and President of GOLD (Giving Others Love through Diversity) Charity, established in 2016, it is a nonprofit organization committed to providing resources and scholarships for low-income students to support their educational goals and achievements.

Mr. Lawrence has also completed numerous internships throughout his academic experience at Benedict, including Google as a software engineer in 2021 and 2022. His hard work and stellar performance both in the classroom and at Google have culminated with Mr. Lawrence receiving a lucrative job offer from Google, which he has accepted.

It is a true honor to say that Lajay will be completing his degree at Benedict College. Throughout his time at this institution, he has not only been a peer leader on campus but also in the community. Additionally, he has maintained a commitment to the Harvest Hope Food Bank starting in his freshman year, and using his influence as a leader, has organized several food drives.

Graduating with a 3.95 GPA, our outstanding senior has completed two internships with Deloitte US, a company that offers services in audit, advisory, tax, and consulting. This summer he will return to Deloitte to complete his third internship with the company in Houston, Texas. The School of Education, Health and Human Services 2022-2023 Outstanding Graduate Student, Coach Frank Hyland, represents one of the inaugural cohorts for the Health and Sport Management department's master's in sport management degree.

Desirous to perform at the highest level in every way, he took on the challenge of returning to school after 30 years and performed with excellence, maintaining a 4.0 GPA as he worked full-time while pursuing his degree.

This excellence extended to his service to Benedict College, often speaking on behalf of the Masters in sport management program. Taking every moment in stride, Coach Hyland worked to balance classes, career obligations, and responsibilities, as well as manage his own mental health and wellness.

Interestingly, this student was also a teacher, serving as the head cross country and track & field coach for Benedict College. In this leadership role, his service was central to his daily duties. Coach Hyland promoted diversity through recruitment efforts of students from across the United States and the globe, particularly from the Caribbean as they are a native of Trinidad and Tobago. In this vein he stated, "I diversified the teams by recruiting student-athletes from all countries and states. This recruitment method helped the student-athletes learn and respect diverse cultures yet build lifelong bonds with people from different backgrounds and beliefs." These efforts embraced and reflected the Benedict College mission.

His further service efforts included sharing the gift of sport participation as an engagement that promotes the transferable qualities of commitment, dedication, and individual willpower. For example, one such activity was in collaboration with the Richland One, the Richland County Sheriff's Department Field, along with the Benedict College track and field program, offered a meaningful experience for elementary, middle, and high school students.
