Faculty and staff who adorn full academic regalia are asked to be seated in a reserved section (right side, facing the stage) in Antisdel Chapel by 10:30 am.

Half-Century Club Members and alumni are asked to be seated in a reserved section (center section) in the Chapel by 10:30 am.

The line-of procession will form on the first floor of the Administration Building between 10:30 and 10:40 am. The procession will depart the Administration Building at 10:50 am. The procession into Antisdel Chapel will begin at 11:00 am.

4. The Opening Remarks Dr. Roslyn C. Artis President and CEO

Dr. Artis: Good morning and welcome to the Benedict College 2024 Founder's Day Convocation.

For more than 150 years, Benedict College has pushed boundaries, lifted voices, and guided the passions of more than 18,000 ordinary graduates who have written extraordinary histories. They wrote history across the campus, in its classrooms, on its fields, on its monuments, murals, plaques, and in the hearts of communities in South Carolina. Few could have imagined in 1870 the impact that this enduring educational institution, founded by Mrs. Bathsheba Benedict, would have in the years to come. Mrs. Benedict believed that "the greatest tools for a successful life were the education of the mind and the nurturing of the spirit." Still hearing her poignant message of faith, this Founder's Day Convocation looks back and then points forward as the College relishes its emergence from "a dilapidated plantation" with a determined purpose to educate formerly enslaved men and women to become preachers and teachers.

Over the years, Benedict College broadened its mission and academic parameters to serve this current generation of students while continuing to be a special place of learning, a cornerstone for community activism, and a leader in changing the trajectory of the lives that she touches. We stand on a foundation of educational excellence that has been handed to us from previous generations of teachers, administrators, and leaders. They firmly believed that "there will be no attempt to hasten the student to the detriment of his drill, but due regard to complete preparation for his life work will be the ideal, rather than a superficial smattering and flash show, and speedy completion of his time of preparation." The current men and women of Benedict College are writing new histories, breaking old barriers, and creating a myriad of transformational educational initiatives for the future. They range from Esports, to cybersecurity, pre-law, supply chain management, pe-med, engineering, the arts, the establishment of a Women's Business Center, a BEST Lives Program, and a graduate program so that the legacy of "BC" continues as "inclusive, pioneering, and family-oriented is respected and cherished." To God, be the glory!

The College began celebrating The Founder's Day Convocation in March 1997 to complement the longstanding Founder's Day Rally. This Convocation is a special occasion to celebrate the history of this institution and to applaud Half-Century Club members, other alumni, and our currently enrolled students. Yet, there still resounds throughout this special occasion a sense of purpose, history, destiny, and duty that are emblazoned in the DNA of this and other Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) and was so stridently articulated by a Benedict College Board of Trustees member in 1920, when he said: "The time was past thank God when you can [sic] be sold. See to it that the time does not, must not, come-when you can be bought."

With your continued support, we will continue to meet the challenges of today and to provide innovative educational opportunities for tomorrow. We will empower our graduates to go from 1600 Harden Street back to their communities, across the nation, and around the world bringing with them great intelligence, social consciousness, and "TheBESTofBC" to lead those whom they find in the dark places to better places, where "the golden sunshine falls."
